Water Quality

Our friends at Winchester Aquarium and Pet Center, "Your Pet Professionals" located at 190 Costello, across from Costco, tested our water sample taken from Lake Neff. You can see them for all your pet needs.

Our lake is, as ever, very healthy and conducive to growing, vibrant, and effervescent fish populations.

Weed Abatement

The weed treatment on the lake has been successful. This time last year saw weeds across the surface of the lake and reports from fisherman and boaters are reporting greatly reduced hydrilla. The section above the silt dam was not treated, allowing for habitat for smaller fish. Several other sections on the shore opposite the road were also left untreated for habitat...

New Campsite

The Lake and Conservation Committee developed a new campsite with firepit on the Opequan Creek in the campground over the Memorial Day weekend. We will be adding a picnic table and bench in the next week.



Eagle Scout Projects

Two Eagle Scout projects were completed in the last month at the Chapter. Jimmy Taylor Jr., Troop 63, built and installed 3 fish attractors in the lake. These structures,



marked with yellow floats, provide structure in the lake for small fish and greatly enhance the lake ecosystem by protecting the young. This greatly supports the sustainability of several species in the lake.





Jackson Wade, Troop 159, built a boat storage rack for the Chapter boats and canoe. This rack cleaned up the shoreline, assisting with mowing operations and helps protect the equipment we use for managing the lake. Jackson



landscaped the area and designed the rack for future expansion.

The Chapter cannot thank these scouts enough for the hard work, environmentally friendly design and solid leadership they exhibited on their projects. These projects provide amazing benefits to our Chapter for ongoing 501c3 missions. We also need to thank members Terry Henry and Ben Storrick for assisting the scouts as Chapter representatives who assisted the scouts.

Lake Neff Boat Use

It is great to see so many members using Lake Neff with their small boats and kayaks. Fishing is in top form and the lake is producing large crappies and aggressive bass. The member rules must be followed regarding personal flotation devices. Everyone in boats <u>MUST WEAR</u> their life jackets. It is not enough to have it in the boat. It must be worn. This is an insurance requirement and if we continue to have issues with it, the committee will need to review allowing boats on the lake.

Campground Use

The rules of the campground are the 7 principles of leave no trace. In a nutshell, this means "take only pictures, leave only footprints." Volunteers are finding every kind of refuse imaginable left at your campsites, including beer bottle caps, bones from cook dinners, partially burned plastics in the fire pits, etc.

This is a conservation-minded organization! Pack out what you pack in! It is completely unacceptable to burn or leave garbage in the fire pits.

We are not able to get trash service in the campground and we do not provide garbage cans in that area. Please remove your trash and if needed, use the garbage cans above the chapter house.

What's Next?

Next up for your Lake and Conservation Committee:

- Installation of aeration equipment in Lake Neff
- Expansion of camping sites around the Chapter
- Beginning work on several USDA projects

RANGE REPORT

The range rules have been changed concerning violations to the range guest policy. If a member is found in violation of the policy, he or she will forfeit range privileges for 60 days, and the case will be referred to the Disciplinary Committee for further action. The updated Range Rules should be read by all range users; they can be found at https://winchester-iwla.org/Rifle-Pistol. Plans call for new signage at the Rifle-Pistol range outlining the Range Guest Policy changes, along with NRA firearms safety rules. John Suter reported that Shotgun range guests can now be registered at the Shotgun range. He also announced the establishment of a new shotgun league. Details may be found on the Chapter website.

Dr Green Memorial Shotgun Rage

Here is a great tip for your shotgun shooting, I'm sure some of you have heard me ask you to try this and been amazed at the results. In Sporting Clays, one-third of lost targets are missed in front, two-thirds are missed behind. The competitors who miss out front are among the winners. My first rule to overcoming Separation Anxiety is to recognize that "they don't fly backwards," and so if you are going to miss, which is inevitable, "miss in front."

OTHER NEWS

Sportsman's Swap Meet

The Sportsman's swap meet mentioned in last month's newsletter as tentatively scheduled for next month has been postponed, perhaps indefinitely. 
DAVID C. PRATER & MARK PRATER MEMORIAL



The Chapter held a memorial service for our long time volunteers David and Mark Prater. The service included soldiers from the USMC who presented David's wife Keiko with a flag for his military service and taps was played. Several friends spoke about memories with the Praters and their contributions to the chapter. It was wonderful to share those stories with the Prater family who came from across the nation to be part of the event.



David was a former Chapter president who was also the rangemaster for all of the ranges. He was involved with all the committees and his work is seen everywhere at the chapter. David created the new member orientation, range rules and range qualification process. He also wrote many grant requests included in the grants were the loner shotguns used at the 5-stand, the





shooting team at the Chapter. He also taught all of the NRA shooting classes. David was a "mountain man"and loved flintlock and muzzle loading shooting; and the lifestyle of that time period. The chapter dedicated the outpost in the campground in David's name. David's dedication included a flag retirement ceremony completed by BSA Troop 159.



Mark Prater was very involved in the chapter supporting his father. He was a tireless volunteer for Lake and Conservation, Education and Training, Range and Special Events committees. Mark did all of the IT work at the chapter. Mark was also the head chef for every event for several years from Christmas parties to kids events. The Chapter will honor his memory by naming the kitchen in his memory.

David and Mark completed about 1300 volunteer hours a year EACH at the chapter. These men with their immense knowledge and skill sets are impossible to replace and their loss greatly impacted chapter operations. We will greatly miss their humor and hard work and all of us mourn the loss of our good friends. The memorial service allowed us to meet their family, share their story of dedication and honor their memories.
